We tailor care to the phases of life our patients are going through, whether that's being a first-time mother, assisting a child who has developmental needs, or helping our elderly patients manage their chronic disease. Our staff make a conscious effort to address the social determinants of health affecting our patients, and work with our community partners to help address these concerns. There are many ups and downs of life, and Ravenswood is here to support our patients through it all.

Each year, our staff continues developing their skills to contribute to better patient care. It's important for clinic staff to learn efficient treatment methods that will improve the experience of our patients, and for administrative staff to improve skills that will keep our clinic sites operating productively. Meeting a new departmental goal or seeing a patient's smile is what empowers our staff to continue growing professionally and reminds us of the impact we make each day for our patients.

Out of all of the medical practices and doctor's offices, Ravenswood was one of 211 practices throughout the state of California to be selected to participate in an Equity & Practice Transformation initiative. Led by the California Department of Health Care Services this program only accepted 29% of applicants. Over the next three years, we look forward to receiving guidance and coaching, attending learning sessions and completing milestones to help our organization prepare for the transition from volume-based to value-based reimbursement.

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Celebrating Four Years of MayView

2020

In 2020, Ravenswood Family Health Network (RFHN) acquired MayView Community Health Center, which includes clinic sites in Palo Alto, Mountain View, and Sunnyvale. With our original clinics in San Mateo County and the addition of the MayView clinics in Santa Clara County, we have been able to extend our footprint and increase access to health care in the Peninsula of the Bay

2021

In 2021, we renovated the MayView Palo Alto Clinic to create a more pleasant and COVID-safe environment for our patients, doctors, nurses, and clinic staff. Three additional exam rooms were created, two of which were designated for optometry services. Our waiting room was expanded to fit more chairs and adhere to social distancing at the peak of the pandemic. Cabinets were replaced, and handwashing sinks and electrical outlets were added throughout the clinic. A handicap accessible bathroom with a lab specimen pass through cabinet was also built.

"It felt like the clinic got a face lift, a morale boost and with that came the sense of wanting to do more and be more for the patients," says Loretta, Service Line Operations Manager for Family Medicine.

2022

In 2022, a mobile dental clinic was launched to provide dental services once a week outside of our Mountain View clinic site. This clinic has made it easier for patients facing transportation barriers to access oral health care without having to travel to our main dental clinic, Ravenswood Family Dentistry, in East Palo Alto.

Social Services and Chiropractic services were also added at our Mountain View and Palo Alto MayView sites.


2023

In 2023, an ADA accessible ramp was constructed at the Palo Alto site, and upgraded the entrance of the building to have an electronic sensor to open the door. The completion of this ramp was especially crucial for our patients who use wheelchairs, have hearing or vision impairments, or have chronic medical conditions. Many of our Palo Alto patients felt much safer going up the ramp.

In addition, we also began providing Podiatry services once a week at our MayView Palo Alto Clinic in September 2023. Our podiatrist, Dr. Javeria Hussaini, offers a comprehensive range of services, including diagnosis, treatment, and management of conditions related to the feet and ankles.

What's Next?

Ravenswood is also looking to increase medical and dental access to underserved populations in Redwood City and Sunnyvale.

In 2025, RFHN expects to construct a dental clinic, which is planned to open that fall. Our longtime partner, Sequoia Healthcare District (SHD) is supporting this capital project by allowing us to convert their SHD offices in Redwood City to a dental clinic. Once fully operational, an anticipated 4,600 patients will have access to comprehensive dental services through approximately 11,000 dental visits each year.

In 2026 or shortly thereafter, we will open a new clinic in Sunnyvale, which will include the following services: Medical, Dental, Behavioral Health, Social Services, Optometry, and possibly Ultrasound and Mammography in a 12,300 square foot facility that will serve 7,200 patients. In April 2024, RFHN took a step towards fulfilling this vision by closing escrow on the purchase of 145 North Wolfe Road in Sunnyvale. Our goal is to raise \$25 million dollars over the next 24 months to construct the new clinic.

Comprehensive Perinatal Services Program

Our Comprehensive Perinatal Services Program (CPSP) is part of the routine care our female patients receive during and after their pregnancy. The program provides prenatal care, health education, nutritional assessment, psychosocial assessment, and referral support for pregnant patients on Medi-Cal. Many times, CPSP is the only source of support our pregnant patients have. The CPSP team helps women navigate a wide range of personal hardships; these commonly include transportation and housing barriers, mental health issues, and food insecurity during pregnancy. Our CPSP team is trained to engage with and support pregnant mothers who have mild symptoms of depression and anxiety, as well as experiencing baby blues after delivery. Baby blues is a term used to describe the feelings of sadness a mother may experience during the first couple of days after giving birth.

Nuanced assistance we provide includes anticipating the psychosocial impact of pregnancy and its aftermath, understanding the role of fathers in maternal mental health, and how fathers can provide additional support to mothers. Our staff empower pregnant patients in asking for emotional or behavioral health assistance and resources. Overall, our CPSP team continues to strive in building strong relationships with our pregnant patients. Many of our patients in CPSP also participate in our CenteringPregnancy® program, which provides further support through a mom's pregnancy journey.

CenteringPregnancy® is a group-care model that provides prenatal care to mothers and families. Patients who are not first-time mothers are welcome to join, too, as they often still have questions surrounding their pregnancies—from pregnancy myths and sleep safety to eating habits. Our CenteringPregnancy® team creates a safe and comfortable environment for pregnant mothers to ask questions and discuss their concerns. During these group sessions, pregnant women learn how to

monitor their own pregnancy progress and perform basic health screenings, such as checking their blood pressure and weight. At each session, they also receive one-on-one consultation time with their providers. Not only do the pregnant patients learn from the health care professionals during these sessions, but also from each other as they build an invaluable network with each other.

During each of the nine sessions, medical providers conduct well-child exams, and medical professionals engage parents in lively discussions regarding parenting and healthy childhood development. Topics include attachment, safe sleep, breastfeeding, nutrition, early literacy, and more. Sessions include screening children for possible developmental delays and new mothers for any symptoms of depression. Additionally, resources that help promote development in children and address stress in parents are provided. Most importantly, parents have the opportunity to bond with other parents going through the same or similar experiences, which in turn allows them to receive much needed social and emotional support.

Virtual Dental Home Program

In partnership with First 5 of San Mateo County and SAGA Foundation, our Virtual Dental Home (VDH) Program brings dental care directly to over 20 preschools and community sites. For many young children, the VDH Program acts as an introduction to the basics of oral healthcare. The program allows us to provide frontline preventative oral health services, help with a child's fear of dental care, provide dental health counseling to the families of the children, and create a primary dental home. This primary dental home is a place for these patients to receive care from start to finish, first performing routine exams and cleanings and providing preventive treatment, then diagnosing patients and referring them to specialty services, and finally performing advanced procedures while following up with each child's family to ensure good health.

We recently held dental workshops in group settings for children ages six to 24 months old and their parents, which had a great turnout. The dental workshop advocated for the importance of early dental care in children, a much-needed topic among parents in the community. In the near future, Ravenswood Family Dentistry will host parent circles to provide extra support for children younger than 24 months old. Each session will have about six infant patients accompanied by their parents to introduce the child to dental care and help the parents learn more about safe dental care practices.

Annual Health Fair

Each year, Ravenswood normally holds an annual health and resource fair, which takes place in the parking lot of our main health center in East Palo Alto. After a couple of dry years of Covid-19 during which no event was held, we brought back this in-person event in August 2023. The Health Fair posed a great opportunity for the community to take advantage of various health resources available to them, such as assistance with renewing their Medi-Cal and registering as a new patient. Children were also able to get their immunizations during the event in preparation for the new school year and had the chance to enjoy face painting, arts and crafts, and other fun activities. In 2023, we attracted 500 visitors. The community gathered around the event stage to watch colorful and lively performances from local dance groups and eagerly awaited raffle drawings and prizes. Thirty-two vendors participated, many local partners, who tabled at the event and shared their own resources. Overall, the event was a success, as many of our guests were able to walk away with big smiles and knowledge to take care of their own and their family's health.

Diabetes Management Program

At Ravenswood, health coaching is offered to patients in both individual and group settings where a number of patients are guided by a health coach to learn more about bettering their health. Through these practices, our patients learn how they can best support their own health with their daily living habits and improve their chronic and preventable illnesses through comprehensive care and guidance.

Recently, the health coaches have been conducting Chronic Disease Self-Management (CDSM) sessions at our main clinic in East Palo Alto and at our MayView clinic sites. The six-week program consists of group sessions focusing on the management of chronic diseases through self-management goals, social support, and building skills to manage the patient's overall health. The program is offered in Spanish, English, and Tongan to fit the linguistic and cultural needs of our patients. The health coaches are trained through the Self-Management Resource Center (SMRC), which strives to help people manage their symptoms, improve quality of life, and minimize healthcare costs. Ravenswood health coaches are guided by SMRC's evidence-based curriculum.

Did You Know?

RefillPro Pharmacy Services: For online prescription refill requests, our pharmacy uses an automated system for refills called RefillPro. This app allows patients to connect to the pharmacy by phone number, submit refill requests by number entry or barcode scan, request refill authorizations, and select pick-up options such as pick-up, mail, or delivery. The app also allows patients to call the pharmacy, get directions, and access store information.

MyChart: In 2020, Ravenswood started using MyChart as the patient portal for patients to manage their health care and communicate with their care team. MyChart is also used by patients for health reminders, requesting appointments, and managing care for family members. Patients can use MyChart through a web browser or mobile app.


